MASS FOR THE SICK

Next Tuesday the twice-yearly Mass for the Sick will take place, at 3.0pm. We will pray for all sick people, and the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated in the course of the Mass. This is a special Sacrament for those who need God's help in bearing, and maybe being healed from, the burden of suffering. It is appropriate to those who have a serious illness or condition, and also those who are living with some particular frailty or disability. We never know what particular gift God will give in this Sacrament, but always there will be an inner strengthening and peace. The bestowal of God's grace is impeded by un-forgiven sin ; sin blocks the channels through which Grace flows into us. And so it is always good to make our Confession before being anointed. I will be in the Confessional from 2.30pm to 2.50pm on Tuesday afternoon, prior t the Mass.
