FROM THE BISHOP - CORONAVIRUS

'If for any reason you do not feel able to receive Holy Communion in the hand, you can still make a good and sincere act of spiritual communion, a practice highly commended by many of the saints, especially St.Alphonsus. At the time of Holy Communion we can turn to the Lord Jesus, and pray to him quietly, saying "Lord Jesus, though I may not at this moment receive you in Holy Communion, please come into my heart, your whole Soul and Divinity, and remain there, and keep me safe. I love you Jesus, always. Amen."

Fr.John adds: I think a number of elderly people who are 'voluntarily isolating' themselves at home are likely to ask for Holy Communion to be taken

to them. Please would any Lay Ministers who are prepared to help me with this tell me.

Series for Lent THE FIVE WOUNDS OF CHRIST 3. The wound in the left foot

Our Lord used his blessed feet to carry him to those in need: those needing to hear the word of truth and the promise of new and endless life, and those needing the healing of body and soul. His feet took him towards those who needed his presence. Those feet which ungrateful mankind in the person of the Roman soldiers pierced with the sharp cruel nails.

Maybe sometimes we use our feet not to carry us towards those whom we can help, comfort, sustain, but to carry us away from them. Sometimes we know what we should do, but we are afraid or otherwise unwilling to do it. We want to avoid encounters which may be costly, difficult, unrewarding. And so we remove ourselves. Our feet are used to carry us away.

Jesus is present in those who need our help, and we can love him by loving them. And so when we use our feet to remove ourselves, we are refusing to come to the aid of Jesus. It's almost as if we are playing a part in making those wounds in his feet, which were always and only used in love.

THE RE-DEDICATION OF ENGLAND AS THE DOWRY OF MARY on Sunday, March 29th

King Richard II first dedicated England to Our Lady in 1381. The Bishops of England and Wales have decided that a re-dedication should now take place, whereby we seek Mary's protection and prayers for our country, and give ourselves anew to her, as her loyal and loving children.

At the end of Mass on Sunday 29th, two things will take place: first we will together make the Angelus Promise, and then after that we will join in the Act of Entrustment.

Today, we will hear a Pastoral Letter which the Bishop has written concerning the Rededication, and then in next week's Newsheet there will be details about the Indulgence which is being offered to those who take part in it.
