Parish Council Just five people have expressed a wish to take part in a distanced meeting of the Parish Council, with limited numbers, so in view of the Chairman's double bereavement, and the uncertainty of how many people can gather (although the latest restrictions really apply to social gatherings - parties - rather than to distanced business meetings) - it seems best if we wait a little before proceeding. I will keep those five names to hand.

HOLY COMMUNION

Yesterday afternoon I went around to a care home just to make sure that it was not possible for me to take Holy Communion to one of our elderly parishioners who is living there. I thought I knew what the answer would be, but I couldn't bear the thought of her being denied the Blessed Sacrament for months on end after having been a devout communicant for all of her life. Yes, I was told that it was 'absolutely impossible' for me to take Holy Communion to her. I went away feeling very sad.

I felt sad, too, that a considerable number of parishioners who are now able to get to Mass are not doing so. We are taking the necessary precautions in church, and if these are followed I really don't think that anyone is at risk. I don't think that we should let our fears - which are perhaps not wholly rational - interfer with our relationship with God, in which the Reception of the living Lord at the Altar plays such a vital and wonderful part. I would ask those people who have not returned to Mass to think very seriously about doing so. The Bishop has confirmed that the recently changed rules about assembly do not

apply to churches, and he emphasizes that our churches are in fact much safer places than many of the other places which we are now entering. Our Lord offers himself to us at the Altar. The grace and spiritual strength which we need are there. Can we rightly continue to say 'No'?

AND THE MASS

Of course I've been curious to know how you feel about the Mass as it is today - no hymns, no Prayer of the Faithful, a briefer homily, no Offertory Procession and no sharing of the Peace. Until today no one, to my surprise, has made any comment. But today a parishioner actually told me how much she prefers the present form of the Mass to how it was before. It was nothing to do with the fact that Mass is now much shorter, making it possible to get back home more quickly to ones coffee/newspaper/ Gin&Tonic/ television. No, it was because, she said 'it seems more directed towards God'.

I feel that too. I like her prefer things as they are now. I feel, as I think that lady does, that the Mass now has more of a sense of purpose, even urgency. There is no way in which we are going to Mass in order to be entertained, or to pass the time. We are going there to DO something very specific and necessary - namely to give God our love expressed in worship and to offer the Holy Sacrifice, by which we are liberated and renewed. And having offered the Christ and his saving work to the Father, to receive the same Christ as our Bread of Life. The 'liturgy' means the 'work'. Maybe we are currently getting down to work in St.Felix in a very good and purposeful way.

Patrons Hitherto Our Lady has been the principal Patron of the East Anglia diocese, with St.Felix, St.Edmund, and St.Etheldreda as secondary patrons. Rome has now ruled that a diocese may only have two patron saints, and so the patrons of the diocese of East Anglia are now just Our Lady of Walsingham and St.Felix.I'm glad that our own St.Felix has been kept!
