It was a joyful celebration, attended by almost the maximum number of people which is allowed to be in church under the present distancing regulations. It was good to have the Bishop with us; he said before leaving how much he had enjoyed the visit. Of course I felt very sorry that I was not able to offer you all the hospitality which had been planned for after the Mass. I was also very appreciative of the cards and kind messages which you sent to me. If you did not receive one of the commemorative cards after the Mass, you are most welcome to take one today.

### **THE CHANDELIER**

I wonder if you have noticed the new chandelier hanging in St.Joseph's Chapel? Ever

since I've been here I've hoped that we may be able to replace the light fittings in the two main side-chapels with something more appropriate and more worthy. The two fittings - one of which still remains - were/are ugly, and gave/give only a very poor light.

The new chandelier was found in a junk shop in Wisbech by my friend Fr.Gladstone Liddell (he gave the homily at my Silver Jubilee Mass), was laboriously cleaned and polished by Donal, another friend, re-wired by Paul, our electrician, and hung by the omni-competent Chris (no easy task, in view of its considerable weight, the chandelier being solid brass). I'm delighted with the result, and I hope that you are too.

The work has been paid for with part of a very generous gift to the church made by Mark Murphy, in memory of his Mother, Hilda, who died a couple of years ago. Hilda, who lived on the High Road East, was a delightful old lady, to whom I used to take Holy Communion. She was one of the earliest woman graduates of the Medical School at University College, Cork. I feel that it is appropriate that the chandelier, as her memorial, should be in St.Joseph's chapel, because there on the wall is a memorial tablet to Mark Anthony McDonnell, an Irish MP in whose memory the Rosary Window and the Stations of the Cross were given.

I wonder whether we will ever be able to add a similar chandelier to the Sacred Heart Chapel? How good that would be if this could happen!
