CONFESSIONS BEFORE CHRISTMAS

It is customary of course to make our Confession and receive absolution before the great festivals, even if not at other times. It is the most important part of our spiritual preparation. Only if we are free from sin and the effects of sin can we truly enter into the joy of those seasons when we especially celebrate the love of God shown in the great actions by which we have been redeemed

Usually we have a Penitential Service before Christmas, but in these strange times it has not been possible to arrange one this year. It is still perfectly possible, though, to make one's Confession. If it is just a single Confession, then it can be heard in the Confessional in the normal way. But because sanitisation of the Confessional has to take place after each one, it is not very practical if a number of people are waiting, and so I am currently using the more open Sacred Heart Chapel for Confessions.

This week I will be in the Chapel to hear Confessions before Christmas on

SATURDAY 5.15pm to 5.45pm

It is almost a century since the discovery of the tomb of Tutankhamun in Egypt. You remember how when Howard Carter first looked into the burial chamber with its incredible treasures, someone behind him asked what he could see : "Wonderful things", he replied.

As we continue to keep this holy season of Advent, and contemplate the events which led up to the Nativity of Our Lord at Bethlehem, we too are looking at 'wonderful things'.

We've been reading at Mass some of the prophecies of the coming of Messiah which are written in the Old Testament. How wonderful that the Father prepared so long and so carefully for the Incarnation-event. How awesome is His age-old plan of redemption, formed from the very moment when mankind lost his friendship and favour through disobedience!

Last week we celebrated the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. How wonderful that the Father prepared the Virgin Mother for her role as Mother of God by preserving her of all trace of sin from the very moment of her conception in the womb of Anna!

Then Joseph - soon we will be filled with wonder as we consider his abundant faith - his readiness to comply wholeheartedly with God's plan, in a way marked by selflessness and humility.

And then Mary herself, chosen of all women to bear the incarnate Christ : the coming of the Archangel, her heroic response, the mystery of the Incarnation itself - how wonderful!

Wonderful things indeed, Surpassing treasures laid before us. May we feel a like awe & wonder to that felt by the archeologist in Egypt. Because we look upon greater treasures still.
