AFTER JULY 19TH.....

As expected, guidance has been issued by the Bishops' Conference regarding the changes which come into force tomorrow. There is a Statement (printed overleaf) and some detailed instructions.

Caution seems to be the watchword as regards churches and services, and overall not much seems to be changing, except that certain things are now advised rather than required. Here are the main provisions which will effect us:

- * Hand sanatising at the entrance and the wearing of face masks at Services is 'strongly recommended', but not demanded.
- * There is no legislation on distancing, but care is urged. I think as we are not bursting at the seams, the present distancing of the pews is best maintained for the immediate future.
- * Singing. Care is to be taken: I will suggest a way forward in next week's Newsheet.
- * The Holy Water Stoups should not be used yet; the Sign of Peace remains suspended, and Holy Communion will continue to be given under one kind..
- * There is no restriction now on numbers at Baptisms, Weddings, and Funerals.
