**Climate Talks** Boni & Kate Pinto, our CAFOD representatives, write 'This year, the UK will host the largest gathering of world leaders ever to take place on British soil : the COP26 climate talks.

As Prime Minister Boris Johnson must push the world leaders to show the ambition we need to keep temperature rises below the disastrous 1.5 degree threshold. This means that all countries must play their part. Wealthy nations, who bear the greatest responsibility for the crisis, need to step up. With the eyes of the world on the UK, we must urge the Prime minister to make sure communities hardest hit by the climate emergency are listened to at COP26. #### THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

#### 7. You shall not commit adultery

Let's be clear. Adultery is when two people, one or both of whom is married to someone else, have sexual intercourse. Fornication is when neither of the two people are married, either to each other or any one else. Both are declared to be wrong by Jesus in his teaching. If it is possible to say that one sin is worse than another, since all sin is an affront against God, then Adultery is the more serious here, because it involves not just an action which is wrong in itself, but also the breaking of the marriage vow.

Why are Adultery and Fornication both wrong? Because in God's plan sexual union belongs within the marriage relationship. It is an expression of the two peoples' lifelong commitment to each other. The proper order -God's ordering of things - is that two people make a solemn commitment to each other in Marriage, and then seal and express that giving of self, the one to the other, by sexual union. Also that action should always, according to Catholic teaching, be open to the procreation of new life, of children who will grow up within the stability of a Christian marriage. Which is rarely the case, I imagine, when adultery or fornication is being committed.

The sin of Adultery leads a person to cheat on God, on his wise and right ordering of things, and to cheat on the person with whom they have made a solemn covenant in marriage. Such cheating can never, I think, lead to inner peace and true happiness. Which is what God wants for us.

#### **COMING SHORTLY!**

The diocese is about to begin a stewardship FAITHFUL STEWARDS OF campaign called GOD'S GIFTS and our Parish has been chosen as one of the first in which it will take place. It happens over three consecutive Sundays, and our Finance Committee has chosen Sundays October 10th. October 17th. and October 24th as the Sundays when it will be run out here. On those three Sundays there will be just One Sunday morning Mass, and it will be at 10.30am : not the usual 9.30am and 11.0am. I am anxious that you should have plenty of warning of this. The 6.0pmSaturday Mass will take place as normal on those three Sundays. Afterwards we will return to our normal pattern.

The campaign is aimed to help us look realistically at our Parish and at ourselves. What are the needs of the Parish? And how can we, together, meet those needs? It is important that all of us, as one family, take part in the exercise ; we are in this together, and each of us will have a part to play. So please put those dates and times into your diary. It is good that it is happening now, as we seek to renew ourselves after the COVID.
