Money Matters Last Sunday £352.87 was given at the offertory and £69.90 for CAFOD. During February, £2,142.00 was donated by way of direct debit.

Benjamin Smalley is our Catechumen - a young man preparing for Baptism. He attends St. Alban's School in Ipswich, and hopes to be baptized here on Holy Saturday evening at the Easter Vigil. This afternoon Fr.John takes him to the Rite of Election at the Cathedral, where, with Catechumens and Candidates (candidates are those who have been baptized in other denominations, but are now seeking admittance to the Catholic Church at Easter) with Catechumens and Candidates from all over the diocese he will be formally 'chosen' (elected) for entrance into the Church, and welcomed by the Bishop. It is a few years since we had a Catechumen in the parish: do please pray for Benjamin, and come to support him on Easter Eve!

And Benjamin Barnett - our Seminarian, preparing for Ordination to the Priesthood at Oscott College. Benjamin is going to be ordained to the Minor Order of Lector (a step in the pathway to the priesthood) on March 17th, along with Anthony and Peter, two other seminarians from our diocese. Bishop Alan will be present at Oscott - just outside Birmingham - for the ordination..Benjamin has very kindly invited me to go over, and much as I would like to do so, I really feel that I should be here to say Mass on St.Patrick's Day. Please continue to remember Benjamin in your prayers. He ask me to give you his greetings, and the assurance of his prayers. I think he is planning to be back with us after Easter.

Aid to Ukraine The Bishop is keen that we should channel our financial aid to Ukraine through Aid to the Church in Need, which is appealing for funds to assist the refugees. The Bishop also asks us to have a retiring collection for this cause: next Sunday has already been booked by CAFOD, and so our collection for Ukraine via Aid to the Church in Need will be on the Mothering Sunday weekend, March 26th/27. The Bishop further asks us to lookout for and support the centres across the Diocese where collections are being made of clothing and food for Ukraine and the refugees that are flooding into Easter Europe.

Fr.John's Day Off Last. and very much least: diocesan meetings etc. seem increasingly to take place on Thursdays, which is Fr.John's Day Off. In recent months he seems only to have got a proper day off about every other week, which is not really good for his well-being.
