From the Chairman of the Finance Committee
'Following our successful appeal in November I have had a number of queries from parishioners regarding Standing Orders and Gift Aid. It appears that some banks have not processed the Standing Order forms you completed and I submitted. If you check your bank statements you will be able to see if your Standing Order has been processed. I have contacted two banks who will not discuss this with me because they will only discuss accounts with the account holder. If your Standing Order has not been processed could you please contact your bank and provide the details of

how much you wish to donate and which day you wish it to be paid on if you still wish to donate. They will ask for the church bank details which are St Felix Church **HSBC** Account Number: **11513869** Sort Code: **40-21-06**. This will set up a Standing Order, not a Direct Debit. Standing Orders can only be changed by you, the account holder.

Direct Debits may be changed by the company to whom the money is paid if the cost of the services provided exceeds the agreed Direct Debit sum. Gift Aid donations are not arranged by the banks. To Gift Aid your donations you must complete a Gift Aid donation form available in the Church entrance and pass this to Fr John or Alan Lamberton. This form is then processed by the Diocese who claim the tax paid on the donated sums on behalf of the church. I apologise for any confusion which may have arisen following our appeal and thank all those who responded so well.'

THE CATECHISM GROUP

When the Group meets on Tuesday it will be looking at what the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says about human beings, the summit of God's creative activity. One of the paragraphs we will be looking at is this :

'Man and woman were made 'for each other' - not that God left them half-made and incomplete : he created them to be a communion of persons, in which each can be a 'helpmate' to the other, for they are equal as persons and complementary as masculine and feminine. . In marriage God unites them in such a way that, by forming 'one flesh', they can transmit human life : 'Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth'. By transmitting human life to their descendants, man and woman as spouses and parents co-operate in a unique way in the Creator's work.'
