FROM THE BISHOP

'Reports on the celebration of Holy Week and Easter across the Diocese have been very positive with great number of people attending the Liturgies and especially for those of Easter Day, we thank God for this grace!

We must build on it to encourage those who have not returned to Mass yet. For as Christians, we have an obligation to gather as the Church on Sunday, the Day of the Lord's Resurrection, to celebrate what the Lord commanded us to do the night before he died.

In the celebration of the Mass he is truly present in Word and Sacrament, ready to fill our lives with his Risen Life. Live-streaming of the Mass has brought great comfort and joy to many over the past two years, and especially the elderly and the infirm. However, for those who are able to come to Mass, the barriers of the last two years which prevented us from doing so in great numbers have now disappeared. Nothing can replace our coming together as the Church, weekby-week, to meet the Lord in reality.

I ask all parishes to use these weeks leading up to Pentecost and beyond to encourage all who have not fully returned to Mass to think about this, and not to be afraid of doing so!'

CONFIRMATION

A Confirmation is always a special day in the life of a Parish, and in the case of the Confirmation tomorrow it will be the first time that a Confirmation has been held in this parish for three years.

It is special of course for the Candidates : it marks their becoming fully initiated into the Catholic Church, and setting out upon their journey as grown-up Catholics. By the Bishop's laying on of hands with prayer, and the Anointing with Chrism, they receive the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit - the gifts of Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Reverence. Precious gifts, which , if their hearts are open to receive them, will make them strong in their Christian Faith and witness.

It is also an important day, you'll say, for their families, who will want to be with them at the Confirmation Mass. Ah but you are part of their family, and so their Confirmation is important to you as well. It is within the context of the family of the Church, of which you are part, that these Gifts of the Holy Spirit are being given, and that the Candidates are setting out on their pilgrimage. You are their brothers and sisters in Christ, and you should be assuring them of your support in the step which they are taking. The obvious way to do that is by being at the Mass tomorrow. And if the Candidates are your brothers and sisters, then the Bishop is your spiritual father. And so also be there to welcome him to your parish!
