CELEBRATING THE MASS

This is the first of a selection of quotations from the *General Instructions* which come at the beginning of *The Roman Missal*. They direct how the Mass, which lies at the heart of Catholic life, is to be celebrated in the Church throughout the world. They are not suggestions, but rules as to how it must be done. The Bishop recently urged us to revisit the *General Instructions*, and to see that we are guided by them. This is a useful exercise, and valuable as we prepare for the feast of Corpus Christi, and the restoration of the Chalice then. Here is a quotation from Chapter I of the *Instructions*, which is headed *The Importance and dignity of the celebration of the Eucharist :* 'The celebration of Mass, as the action of Christ and of the People of God, is the centre of the whole of Christian life for the Church both universal and local, as well as for each of the faithful individually. For in it is found the high point both of the action by which God sanctifies the world in Christ and of the worship which the human race offers to the Father, adoring him through Christ,, the Son of God, in the Holy Spirit. In it, moreover, during the course of the year, the mysteries of redemption are celebrated, so as to be in some way made present. As to the other sacred actions and all the activities of Christian life, these are bound up with it, flow from it, and are ordered by it.'

And in Chapter II, The Structure of the Mass

'At Mass or the Lord's Supper the People of God is called together, with a Priest presiding and acting in the person of Christ, to celebrate the memorial of the Lord, or Eucharistic Sacrifice. In an outstanding way there applies to such a local gathering of the holy Church the promise of Christ: 'Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in their midst.' For in the celebration of Mass, in which the Sacrifice of the Cross is perpetuated, Christ is really present in the very assembly gathered in his name, in the presence of the minister, in his word, and indeed substantially and uninterruptedly under the Eucharistic species.

The Mass consists in some sense of two parts, namely the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, these being so closely interconnected that they form one single act of worship. For in the Mass is spread the table both of God's Word and the Body of Christ, and from it the faithful are to be instructed and refreshed. There are also certain rites that open and conclude the celebration.'
