THE BLESSED SACRAMENT IV

A reminder that this series is the principal part of the Catechesis (teaching) on the Blessed Sacrament which Bishop Peter said should take place in every parish prior to the re-introduction of the Chalice - that is the option of receiving the Precious Blood of the Lord in Holy Communion at every Mass. We are taking this current situation as a good opportunity to renew our understanding of all aspects of the Blessed Sacrament in our lives, before the Chalice is once more available to us. You will remember that we hoping that this restoration will happen at the end of July - the Month of the Precious Blood. No one will be forced to receive Holy Communion under both kinds. But some, I know, will welcome the opportunity to be able to do so.

One of those aspects of Holy Communion which we need to consider is Preparation and Thanksgiving. We prepare in our everyday lives for any significant moment and event, and few things are more significant than the moment when the risen Lord comes to us in this special and wonderful way which he has chosen.

How should we prepare ourselves to welcome Jesus in his sacramental presence? **First** of course the very best preparation is to live a life in which we are truly seeking to love God and love our fellow men and women. This matters far more than the reading and saying of special Eucharistic

devotions. We love God most obviously through our life of prayer - spending time with him, giving him our attention. And we love our neighbour by being there for him or her, being generous, helpful, kindly, patient, forgiving. A daily life modeled on that of Jesus is the very best preparation we can make for Holy Communion.

Then **Second**, the first part of the Mass is meant to be a preparation for Holy Communion. As you know, the first half of the Mass is in essence the old Jewish Synagogue Service, with readings, psalmody, homily, and Intercessions. In the first century it became joined to the 'Supper Service' which Jesus instituted at the Last Supper namely the Great Thanksgiving over bread and wine, the offering of the Holy Sacrifice, and then the sharing in what has been consecrated (transformed) and offered. The Church found that what is now the first part o the Mass - principally the hearing of God's word - made an excellent preparation for receiving Holy Communion.

Third, yes there should be some special prayer-time directed towards preparing ourselves for Holy Communion. We should aim to arrive in Church a little before Mass begins, and spend time - not chatting to others - but being quiet with God, and telling him that we are looking forward to receiving this wonderful Gift, Jesus himself. Maybe we will have begun that preparation the night before. We may ask Jesus to bring particular graces to us when he comes. We may want to tell him that we are sorry for something which we have said or done. We may want to heighten our love of him by thanksgiving for his gifts.

And then Thanksgiving for Holy Communion. We know it is right to thank people for even a small gift - how much more should we thank God for such an amazing gift! We will want to say thank you straight after Communion (rather than chatter!) and we will want to recall this wonderful coming at odd moments during the course of the day. Our Lord's gift of himself must never become 'matter of fact', casual. It's far too special for that. It is a big event for all of us.
