In this situation, I'm asking whether there are maybe half a dozen or more people who would be prepared to help me fill this gap? If you are prepared to help, please will you tell me, and we will then be able to plan who will do what, and when we will do it. Giavanna has kindly offered to order the flowers before she goes away, and I will then collect them from Ipswich. You don't need to be a Constance Spry to assist! (I think that maybe dates me?)

The Posada The list is now up on the notice board. Would you like to welcome Mary and Joseph into your home as they make their way to Bethlehem for the birth of Jesus? The Posada figure will be blessed at the end of Mass next Sunday (Advent Sunday), and will then (hopefully) begin to make its way around the parish, as different people 'take in' Mary & Joseph overnight. It can be a very special part of our preparation for Christmas, heightening our awareness of how this is a time when we await with prayer the Nativity of Our Lord. There is s short Act of Worship which is made when the Posada is in your home: copies of this are

provided, and I've put one of them up on the noticeboard for you to see. We are encouraged to invite one or two of our friends and neighbours in to join us for this - and maybe a cup of coffee or something afterwards. It can have the effect of spreading the Gospel message to others - all of us, remember, are commissioned to share the Faith. I'm especially hoping that someone will offer to take in the Posada on the night of Advent Sunday; it would be nice to be able to hand it over to its first 'hosts' straight after it has been blessed at Mass.

IS HE TRULY YOUR KING?

Today we joyfully acclaim Jesus as our King, as we come to the end of the Church's year, and prepare to begin a new year next Sunday, when the season of Advent begins.

But what are we saying when we address Our Lord Jesus Christ in this way? What are we really saying about him, and about ourselves?

One of the functions of kingship is to make laws - to legislate (all laws passed by Parliament in our own country have to receive the Royal Assent): the King gives his subjects laws which they are bound to obey. If we acclaim Jesus as our King, then, we must obey the laws which he gives us - we are not free to do what he says or not, just as we please. Amongst the rules which he gives us, are those that we should forgive, that we should not judge others, and that we should love our neighbour. We cannot properly call Jesus our king if we are not ready to obey him. He is only truly our king if we accept him as such by willingly submitting our own will to his, as his loyal, obedient, and loving subjects.
