Money Matters Last Sunday £462.59 was given in cash at the Offertory, and £40.10 for CAFOD. During November, a total of £2,233.00 was given by Direct Debit, £1,674.57 was given on the Plate, and £119.99 by the Dona machine, a total of £4,027.56. Today there is a retiring collection for the Dependent Priests' Fund.

PREPARATION

This latter part of Advent is a time of fervent preparation. We are preparing our homes for the festival with Christmas decorations, preparing our larders with abundant stocks of food and drink, and preparing the parcels and the cards which we intend to exchange. In the midst of all this activity, it is very easy to neglect our spiritual preparation for what is essentially a great feast of the Church – the celebration of the Birth of Our Lord at Bethlehem. It would be sad to be found unready, unprepared, for the very thing that matters most.

What spiritual preparation should we be making for Christmas? Maybe two things. First, to consider carefully how God prepared for the first Christmas. To re-read and think about how he sent John the Baptist as Messenger. How he sent the Archangel Gabriel both to Mary and to Joseph, announcing the forthcoming birth. How he led Mary to visit Elizabeth, and the unborn Baptist to recognize who it was who had entered his house, and to leap for joy in his Mother's womb. And then how Mary and Joseph made their way to Bethlehem, where the birth was to take place. A thinking-about, a meditation, on these events prepares us well for their fulfillment in the birth of Jesus.

And then second, to practice penitence, as John the Baptist urges us to do. To look carefully at our lives, and see in what ways we are falling short in our loving of God and neighbour. And then to bring our faults to God in Confession so that they can be forgiven, and we are able with pure and joyful hearts to approach the Christmas festival. For purity and joy go together – only by forgiveness, by reconciliation with God, can we know real joy. So sieze the opportunity! Don't miss the opportunity which this week brings for accepting God's precious gift of forgiveness!
