**Mass for the Sick** I promised a new date for the Mass for the Sick: it is Tuesday, June 25<sup>th</sup>. The Sacrament for the Sick (anointing) will be available, and as usual an Afternoon Tea will be served afterwards.

#### **OBLIGATION?**

Are you a parent? And if so has it ever arisen that you have asked your child to do something - something simple and sensible, to their own benefit and that of the wider family – and they have simply refused to do what you asked? I wonder how you felt, how reacted?

In the Catholic Church we have something called Holy Days of Obligation. They are a handful of very special days in the Church's Year, when the Church asks us to be at Mass. Days like Christmas Day, The Assumption, Corpus Christi, and -last week- Ascension Day. The Church asks us to come together to give thanks for these great events, these great showings of God love and purpose. Doing so deepens our own faith, and witnesses to the Faith too. It is a very reasonable

request which the Church makes, and one which one would expect the sons and daughters of the Church to be eager to agree to.

Last Thursday, Ascension day, there were three Masses in the Parish, and the attendance at each of them was very poor. The large majority of parishioners ignored the Church's request that we should be at Mass on that day. The Church's request was right and a reasonable. I think the refusal of so many was very sad.

# MARIAN DEVOTIONS II - REGINA COELI

Regina Coeli laetare, Alleluia! Quia, quem meruisti portare, Alleuia! Resurrexit, sicut dixit, Alleluia! Ora pro nobis Deum, Alleluia!

Rejoice, Queen of Heaven, Alleluia!
Because the One whom you were fit to bear, Alleluia!
Has risen, just as he said, Alleluia!
Pray for us to God, Alleluia!

This is the Anthem of Our Lady which we use during Eastertide – at the end of the Office of Compline each day, and at other times too. In some churches it is used at the end of Mass during Eastertide. It is also used in place of the *Angelus*, which we traditionally say at Mid-day and at 6.0pm each day, celebrating the Incarnation. Its catchy tune expresses the joy which Christians feel at the Resurrection of Jesus – his new life in which we share. It is not known who composed *Regina Coeli*, but it is thought to date from the twelfth century.

It reminds us of the great joy which Mary must have felt at that first Easter, after the profound sorrow of her Son's Passion and Crucifixion. It reminds us too of her role in God's plan, in bearing (giving flesh to) the Divine Word, and of her readiness to assist us by her prayers. How right it is that we should ask for those prayers! How much we need them!
