ELECTION

What a run-up to the election there has been! We can be forgiven if we're feeling a bit saturated by it all. But now the fateful week has come!

As we decide how to cast our vote on Thursday we have to take into account both social and financial matters. But for us Catholics there is a further dimension to consider, and that is the moral dimension. We feel passionately about the value and dignity of human life, a precious gift from God – a gift to us, and yet one which also continues to belong to Him. We are not free to dispose of this gift. All life is His. And so we view with horror and revulsion the threats - which grow ever louder - to both the beginning and end of human life. There are loud and insistent calls being made for both the further easing of the process of obtaining an abortion, and also in the legalisation of euthanasia. These are terrible offences against God, and against our dignity as human beings.

Personally, I would not wish to vote in the election for any candidate who supported either of these great evils – abortion or euthanasia. We must vote not just as citizens but as Catholics.

Fire Safety Awareness Course Badcock writes 'The Course will be on Thursday August 1st 10.00am – 12.30pm in the Church Hall. It will provide a general overview of what to do in the event of a fire, the principles of fire prevention and the use of fire extinguishers. The instructor is an experienced former member of the Fire Service. It is being run as part of our parishes' Fire Prevention Plan and was recommended by our fire risk assessors. It is free to attend, and all parishioners and volunteers are welcome. There are 15 places and to reserve a place, please enter your name and contact details on the sheet at the back of the church. This is an ideal opportunity for us to increase our understanding of fire risk and to improve our personal safety both at church and at home.'

A NEW PROJECT

Since the *Alive in Faith* project nearly ten years ago, the money which comes back to the parish for a Parish Project (agreed by the diocese), has been accruing. Initially our project was the renewal of the Sanctuary, but since that was paid for nearly thirty thousand pounds has gradually become

available. It was agreed at a recent meeting of the Parish Council that we should seek permission to use this money for the restoration of the East (Rosary) window behind the Altar. It is of a similar age to the Nave windows, and as with them, the leading has become in need of renewal. The Rosary window is a great treasure, loved by us all, and I'm sure you will agree that its preservation is a most worthy project. We have made application to the diocese to use the money in this way. I'll say more about this plan next week.

THE CHARITY AUCTION

The Charity Auction held last Friday as a thanksgiving for the restoration of the Nave windows was a huge success. Both socially – everyone said what a very enjoyable evening it had been – and also financially: we raised the incredible sum of £2,183 to be divided between the charities Mary's Meals and Let the Children Live! - both charities providing food and education for deprived children in the poorest parts of the world. We are very grateful to both those who donated Promises and Items, and those who purchased them. Also to Richard May who came over from Dereham to act as Auctioneer; to Donal Hannan who organized the Auction; to Edwina and her Team who prepared and served delicious refreshments – and to many others who helped in one way or another to make the event such a great success.
