The Rosary

On 7th October we celebrate Our Lady of the Rosary. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (paragraph 2708) highlights that this method of prayer is one of the ways in which we can prayerfully meditate on the mysteries of Christ. When we do this, we are following the example of Our Lady who pondered the Word in her heart (Luke 2:51).

St Teresa of Avila on Prayer

The 15th October is the feast day of St Teresa of Avila (also known as St Teresa of Jesus) who lived in Spain in the 16^{th} Century and was – and is – a great teacher for us on prayer.

Teresa had a very attractive personality and enjoyed - and greatly valued - human friendship. She came to realise, however, that her greatest friend of all was Christ and she described prayer as 'taking time frequently to be alone with Him who we know loves us' (*Life*, Chapter 8, no. 5).

She wrote several books on prayer and the spiritual life including the *Interior Castle*, the *Way of Perfection* and the *Book of her Life*.

After her death a bookmark was found on which she had written:

Let nothing disturb you.
Let nothing frighten you.
All things are passing away.
God never changes.
Patience obtains all things.
Whoever has God lacks nothing;
God alone suffices.

Making time each day to be with this great friend of ours – Jesus Christ – is transformative. We ask St Teresa to pray for us that we will, throughout our lives, deepen our friendship with Christ so we can be transformed more and more, by his grace, into the people he wants us to be.
