Posada – an Advent devotion

Meaning 'Inn' in Spanish - the tradition of the Posada during Advent is a way of welcoming into our homes Mary and Joseph as they make their way to Bethlehem where the Christ-child will be born. The *Posada* statue will be blessed at the start of Advent and then parishioners are invited to host the statue in their own home for one night. Each parishioner/family that hosts the *Posada* are then responsible for liaising with the next people on the list for the transfer of the Posada from one home to another. Prayer leaflets will be available so that when hosting the *Posada* these prayers can be said together by all in the house as a way of preparing ourselves to welcome God's message of salvation into our lives, hearts and homes. The New Translation of Readings at Mass

Next Sunday marks the start of our using the *English Standard Version – Catholic Edition* (*ESV-CE*) translation of the Word of God. In addition, the psalms used at Mass will also be in a new translation – known as the *Abbey Psalms and Canticles*. More information about the New Translation is contained in helpful leaflets entitled *The New Lectionary Explained* at the back of Church. In moving from the familiar translations to the new ones we are being presented with a gentle challenge to hear the Word of God afresh – prompting our further reflection – in the Church - under the guidance of the Holy Spirit – to make God's Word a reality in our lives.
