Defend your faith...

A series of short answers to potential criticisms of the Catholic Faith have been prepared and will appear in the newsletter over coming weeks. They provide a short reply which you may find helpful when discussing or sharing your faith with friends, family and others...

If Christ has redeemed humanity, surely I am saved and do not need to go to Mass?

Reply: Yes, we were justified by Christ's death on the cross but our faith tells us that we have a role to play in our relationship with God: we must try to become holy and worthy of heaven. The early Christians did not sit on their hands and say 'We are saved, so there is nothing left for us to do.'

The Church is Christ's mystical body on earth and the Mass takes pride of place in our religion. Attending Mass, the continuation in time of the sacrifice of Christ, is at the core of our faith and is vital to our pursuit of sanctification.
