ROSARY WINDOW Restoration Project

On 22nd April, scaffolding will be erected in preparation for the repairs to the stone tracery supporting the Rosary Window.

This work is done while the windows are still in place to minimize the ingress of stone dust into the church.

Once the masonry repairs have been completed, Mr Terry Devlin will begin the removal of the glazing which will start on Monday 19th May.

The restoration of the glass itself will be undertaken in the workshop and take several weeks to complete. After which the restored window will be replaced.

Apologies for any inconvenience caused during this time, but we have no doubt that the result will be well worth it.

Many thanks to all of you for supporting this project. It will be our legacy to future generations of parishioners.

Defend your faith...

A series of short answers to potential criticisms of the Catholic Faith which may be helpful when discussing/sharing your faith with others...

Many people like reading their horoscopes or having their palms read. It is just a bit of fun, isn't it?

Reply: Only God can reveal the future via prophets or saints and we should place all our hopes in Him alone. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (paragraph 2116) is quite clear: "All forms of divination are to be rejected: recourse to Satan or demons, conjuring up the dead or other practices falsely supposed to 'unveil' the future. Consulting horoscopes, astrology, palm reading, interpretation of omens and lots, the phenomena of clairvoyance, and recourse to mediums all conceal a desire for power over time, history and, in the last analysis, other human beings, as well as a wish to conciliate hidden powers. They contradict the honour, respect and loving fear that we owe to God alone."
