Defend your faith...

A series of short answers to potential criticisms of the Catholic Faith which may be helpful when discussing/sharing your faith with others...

Can't I be a Christian without having to be a member of the Church?

Reply: The short answer to this question is No!

Jesus founded a community – the Body of Christ (Eph 5:23) – the Church – one Church - built on the 'rock' of Peter the Apostle (Mt 16:18). After His resurrection, just before He ascended to Heaven, Jesus clearly gives His authority to the leaders of the Church – the Apostles - sending them out in His name to do his work (Mt 28:18-20). Also... when Saul (who persecuted the Church) met Jesus on the road to Damascus Jesus asked him - not why are you persecuting my followers, but why are you persecuting Me (Acts 9:4).

This close identification of Jesus with the Church was also understood by those who came after the Apostles – e.g. St Cyprian, a bishop and martyr in the 3rd Century who said that someone cannot have God for his father who does not have the Church for his mother (CTS *Apologia* p35).

Our secular western culture puts great emphasis on the individual's self-reliance and freedom to choose whatever aspects of spirituality or religion feel right at the time. But human fulfillment only comes through the Truth.

The Church exists to bring all people together into the full knowledge of the Truth revealed by God through Jesus Christ – showing us the way to live together now & into the future - with God and all the

Being still - before the Blessed Sacrament - in a Catholic Church...

I once read a short reflection by Cardinal Basil Hume which went something like this... Catholic Churches are places where we find the real presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament - in the Tabernacle. It's a very good thing to make a visit to a Catholic Church and to simply sit or kneel – conscious of - and focused on - Our Lord present before us in this way. And if we are prepared to give time to do this - to visit – to remain there – still - for a while - we can find that all our worries, concerns, thoughts, feelings can gently unfurl in His loving presence.

It's an opportunity to receive His help and peace. It does work
