Defend your faith...

A series of short answers to potential criticisms of the Catholic Faith which may be helpful when discussing/sharing your faith with others...

Why do Catholics ask Mary and the Saints to intercede for them – aren't Mary & Saints dead?

Reply: Catholics belong to a family – the Mystical Body of Christ – and its members are alive and dead. They are either still alive in this earthly life or their earthly life has now ended and they are in eternity with God. Death therefore does not break up this family and Christ urged us to pray for one another. This understanding has grown through the writings of St John and St Paul in the New Testament and also through the Church Fathers (the immediate successors of the Apostles). But it makes sense when we are asking others to pray for us to ask those closest to God to do us this favour - which means Our Lady and the Saints. And we always remember that the only person we actually pray to is God - when we seek the intercession of Mary and the Saints we are not praying to them, but asking them to pray
