Defend your faith...

A series of short answers to potential criticisms of the Catholic Faith which may be helpful when discussing/sharing your faith with others...

Christ was a great and holy man but was he really divine?

Reply: This challenge has been made on and off since the early centuries of the Church, but has always been repulsed. It is quite clear that, in particular after Christ's resurrection, his early followers believed Jesus to be God made man. St Peter, chosen by Christ to lead his Church, said 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God' (Mt 16:16). St Paul, who knew the Apostles, wrote '...Christ, who is God over all...' (Rom 9:5) and 'For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily' (Col 2:9). The Apostles did not believe Jesus taken up to heaven as a holy man, but as God.
