Reflection on today - Gaudete Sunday...

Advent is a season of rejoicing because it revives the expectation of the most joyful event in history: the birth of the Son of God by the Virgin Mary. And so, as Christmas Day approaches so our joy grows. The third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete which means 'rejoice' or 'praise.' We might think of the joy of the shepherds who journeyed to see Jesus in Bethlehem and we note that, in contrast to the purple of the other candles, the third candle of our Advent wreath is pink, the colour for joy! This joy results from our knowledge that God is not distant but close, not indifferent but compassionate, not aloof but a merciful Father who follows us lovingly - respecting our freedom. We pray that this joy will transcend all our difficulties during our lives here on earth.

Volunteers to Support School Admission Appeals

The Diocese of East Anglia Schools' Service is seeking volunteers to serve as school admission appeals panel members, helping ensure parents' rights are upheld when a child is not offered a place at their preferred Catholic school. Panel members play a vital role in considering cases where parents wish to challenge a refusal of admission. Each hearing typically lasts 20 to 30 minutes, although some may take longer. Panel members are always able to decide their own availability, making this a flexible opportunity suited to those available during school hours. Appeals may be heard in person or *via* video conferencing, and volunteers can express a preference for the type of hearings they are comfortable with. All panel members will receive training. To ensure a balanced and fair process, each panel is made up of lay members, people without professional involvement in education, and education members, people with experience working in or under-standing schools. Individuals cannot sit on panels for schools with which they have a personal connection e.g. being a parent, governor or staff member.
