Sunday of the Word of God

Today provides a little *nudge* or *reminder* that listening to God's Word – the Scripture readings from the Bible we hear at Mass – is an important part of our Catholic identity - and when God speaks - He calls us! Although the disciples in today's Gospel responded 'immediately' our own experience may sometimes be different. Even the Saints have sometimes struggled to respond as they should. We are all imperfect disciples and we need help to follow the Lord. It's worth remembering – therefore - that the One who calls is also the one who supports, guides and strengthens us on our way. So... struggling is not a cause for despondency, but rather an invitation to step forward in faith. The One who calls never abandons us – He is there always to help us carry out what we are called to **be** and what we are called to **do**.

The City of Corinth... Second readings at Sunday Mass at the moment are taken from St Paul's first letter to the Christian community in this city. Corinth was on the trade route between the eastern and western Mediterranean - on a narrow piece of land joining southern to northern Greece. It had a port facing east *and* west and has been described as a turbulent and booming city at that time. Paul is writing to them from Ephesus (in modern day Turkey) around the year AD56. And he's writing out of necessity - as a teacher and shepherd. He is loving, but also stern and uncompromising. For example, in today's reading, he is urging them to be united in their community – it is in Christ that we find our unity – for it is Christ – and only Christ - who has died and risen again for us.
